


Assistance in Obtaining Funds for Member Cities

HCCZ supports the member cities and their local HCP partners in their efforts to obtain subsidies, and helps obtain funds for the activities outlined in the City Health Development Plans. Since 2001, the Association has been issuing **supporting statements** on individual grant applications of the cities, and arranging for consultations and assistance by the grantors during the preparation of the projects.

[Professional Assistance in Preparation of Projects]

The Association has established co-operation with Kralovehradecka agentura regionalniho rozvoje (Hradec Kralove Agency for Regional Development, "KARR") as a long-term partner for the preparation of projects, consultations and training, particularly with respect to EU funds.

The Association intends to further develop co-operation with Informacni centrum neziskovych organizaci (Non-Profit Organisations Information Centre, "ICN") in the area of consultations regarding the HCP partners' projects in individual cities.

HCCZ Campaign

[HCCZ Newsletter]

As part of the media campaign organised for HCCZ by the media agency **Spiralis** since May 2002, HCCZ has been publishing its monthly Newsletter. The Newsletter is distributed to all major nationwide media with which Spiralis has established co-operation.

Through e-conferences on the eGate server, the Newsletter reaches hundreds of participants in these discussion groups. In addition, it is translated into English and sent to approximately 100 addresses in Europe, USA and Australia – mainly the WHO offices, national Healthy Cities networks and selected Healthy Cities, universities, etc. outside the Czech Republic.

In the Czech Republic, the Newsletter is officially delivered to WHO LO Prague and the Czech Ministry of Health. HCCZ member cities mostly use the Newsletter in the PR within the local authority and with respect to the HCP partner organisations.

The Newsletter and the entire campaign are a product of efficient co-operation among HCCZ and individual cities; they strongly rely on information provided by the HCP co-ordinators. The media campaign also focuses on the joint nationwide activities of the Czech Healthy Cities (see below).

[Nationwide Events]

The central event of the year is the annual National Conference of the Healthy Cities of the Czech Republic. HCCZ held its 9th national conference in Ceske Budejovice in March 2002. The conference was attended by Dr. Agis Tsouros, Head of the Healthy Cities Project at the WHO/EURO office in Copenhagen, as well as representatives of the Czech Ministry of Health and Ministry of Environment.

Throughout the year, HCCZ devotes considerable efforts to nationwide promotion of several major (particularly international) activities, the regional implementation of which is facilitated by the individual member cities depending on their specific interests. These activities presently include the six events listed below (see Chart 3); hundreds of events took place on these occasions in the Healthy Cities in 2002:

- February: 30 Days for Civil Sector


- April: Earth Day

Methodological Assistance to Cities

[HCCZ Strategy and Methodology for Effective Implementation of WHO HCP and Local Agendas 21 in the Czech Republic]

The tool to implement the Healthy Cities Project and Local Agendas 21 in the Czech Healthy Cities is the **New Gate 21** strategy. HCCZ helps implement this procedure directly in the individual member cities through facilitating team work, consultations, etc.

In 2000, the HCCZ methodology was awarded as a Worldwide Project EXPO 2000. In 1998 and 2001, HCCZ received the WHO/EURO quality certificates for the procedure and results achieved in the Czech Republic.

[E-conferences on eGate Server]

E-conferences facilitate efficient communication among HCCZ and individual member cities. For internal communication, there is an e-conference of HCP co-ordinators and one of HCP politicians.

In addition, the eGate server offers 11 public e-conferences on various specialised topics. The most frequently visited are the e-conferences on health, local Agenda 21 and the environment, with 150 to 200 people from all over the Czech Republic taking part in each of these conferences.
